chance to go for an outing to Varanasi. It was the first picnic in their life and also visiting Varanasi and Water Park. All groups thanked Sr. Jaya who provided us the vehicle and Sr. Lynette and Community who provided us the meals.

We are grateful to Dr. Utham whose contribution helped us to make a bamboo shelter for one of our non-formal education centres.





In the first week of June we started our 6th non formal education centre in the



slum known as Bakshi Bang.

Heat or rain, never stopped us in going forward with our social work. Even though it was very hot all our activities are going on well.

We got an invitation from SBI (State Bank of India) to have a short program for our slum children. We could take 15 children from our non-formal education centre and they took part in Sisters Neeta and Sharon also accompanied us and the SBI authorities encouraged them provided writing materials for all 15 children as well as writing materials for all 150 children of the centre.















Though July dawned with the promise of rain, there is no prospect of rain in our area and the earth seems to groan under this extremely hot and dry weather. Despite this scorching heat all of us kept well, thanks to God's Providence. Let us hope the earth will be blessed with enough rain to quench her thirst and once again bring life, freshness and vitality!


